## REMOTE CONTROL



## REMOTE CONTROL UNIT

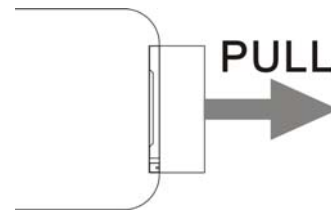
The Remote Control Unit can operate the unit from a distance. When operating the remote control unit, point it towards the front panel of the unit.

- Even if the remote control unit is operated within the effective range, remote control operation may be impossible if there are any obstacles between the unit and the remote control.
- If the remote control unit is operated near other appliances which generate infrared rays, or if other remote control devices using infrared rays are used near the unit, it may operate incorrectly. Conversely, the other appliances may operate incorrectly.

The remote control unit has a built-in magnet. If the remote control is not in use, place it to the side of the unit where a stick of magnet label lies.

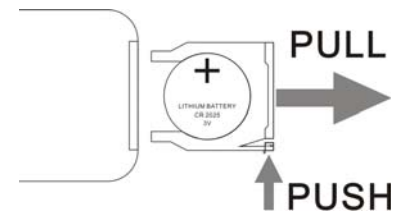
### TO ACTIVATE THE REMOTE CONTROL

The remote control is built with cell battery before shipment. To activate the battery, remove the transparent plate at the bottom of the remote control.



### BATTERY INSTALLATION

1. Remove the battery compartment cover.
2. Put in the lithium battery (CR2025, 3V  $\text{---}$ ). Make sure that the battery is inserted with the positive '+' and negative '-' positioned correctly.
3. Close the cover.



### Battery Replacement

If the distance required between the remote control unit and main unit decreases, the battery is exhausted. In this case, please replace the battery with new one.

### Battery Precautions

- Be sure to insert the battery with correct positive + and negative - polarities.
- Refer to the precautions on the battery labels.
- When the remote control unit is not to be used for a long time (more than a month), remove the battery from the remote control unit to prevent it from leaking. If it leaks, wipe away the liquid inside the battery compartment and replace the battery with new one.
- Do not heat or disassemble batteries and never dispose of old batteries by throwing them in a fire.

## UNDER MOUNTING THE UNIT

**IMPORTANT:** You should only use the mounting accessories (included) when you mount the unit. Use of unapproved accessories that have not been designed specifically for this unit may lead to safety hazards.

1. Use the provided Cabinet Mounting Template to location where you want to mount the unit. Drill the mounting holes directly then done, remove the template.

**Caution:** To reduce the risk of danger, consult the technician if the location you want to mount the unit is firm enough to hold weights and safe before you do the mounting.

2. The MOUNTING KIT is highlighted (refer to illustration (a)).

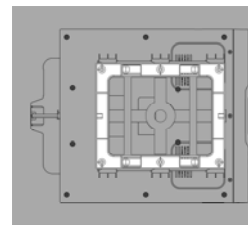

3. Pull out the MOUNTING KIT (refer to illustration (b)).

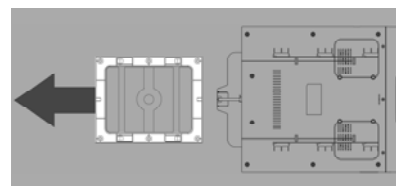

4. If you find unit has to be mounted too high to reach, use the supplied long plastic poles. Insert the long plastic poles into the position holes (refer to illustration (c)).

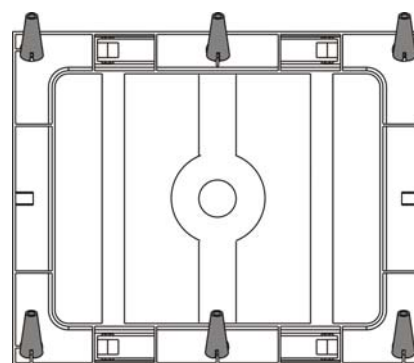

5. Reverse the MOUNTING KIT (refer to illustration (d)).

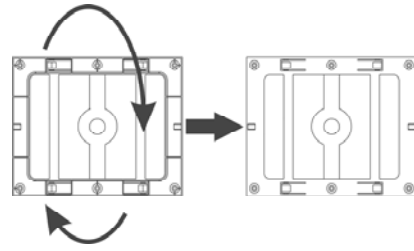

6. Position the MOUNTING KIT and fix it on the mounting place with the supplied screws (refer to illustration (e)).

**Caution:** To reduce the risk of fire, do not place any heating or cooking apparatus beneath this unit.

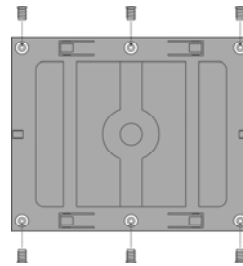

7. Slide the unit back to the MOUNTING KIT (refer to illustration (f)).

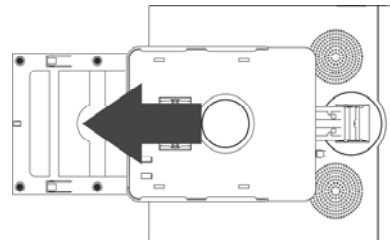
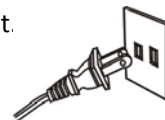

## CONNECT THE POWER CABLE

Unwind the power cable and insert the plug into the household working electrical outlet.

Now the unit is ready to use.










## SET THE CLOCK

When the power cable is connected to the electrical outlet, “12:00” starts to blink on the screen. If you find the unit reverses to this display, you need to set the time.

1. Press and hold **TIME** button (or **MENU/TIME** button on remote control) for approx. 2 seconds. Hour digits start to blink.
2. Press **UP / DOWN** button (or **▲ / ▼** button on remote control) to set the hours.
3. Press **TIME** button (or **MENU/TIME** button on remote control). And then the minute digits start to blink.
4. Press **UP / DOWN** button (or **▲ / ▼** button on remote control) to set the minutes.
5. Press **TIME** button (or **MENU/TIME** button on remote control) to again to save the setting.

## SET THE COUNT DOWN TIMER

You can set the count-down timer and when the preset time is reached, the buzzer will alert.

1. Press the **COUNT DOWN** button (or  button on remote control) "000" shows on the display.
2. Press **UP / DOWN** button (or  /  button on remote control) to set the timer. You can set up to 120 minutes at most.
2. Press the **COUNT DOWN** button (or  button on remote control) again to save the setting and the timer starts to work.  
**TIP:** To view the remained time, briefly press the **COUNT DOWN** button (or  button on remote control).
3. When the set time has expired, the buzzer will goes off.
4. Press any button to stop the buzzer.
5. To terminate the countdown timer, press and hold the **COUNT DOWN** button (or  button on remote control) until the icon () disappears from the display.

## TURN ON OR SET TO STANDBY

Press the **STANDBY/ON** button to turn the unit ON.

Press it again to set the unit to standby mode.

## SET THE SOUNDS

### SET THE VOLUME LEVEL

Press the **VOLUME DOWN / VOLUME UP** button (or  /  on remote control) to adjust the volume level.

### SET THE EQ

Press the **EQ** button on the remote control to select a desired mode: flat, rock, pop, jazz or classic.

## LISTEN TO THE RADIO



Press the **FUNCTION** button repeatedly to select radio mode.

### SELECT A BAND

Press the **BAND** button repeatedly to select AM or FM.

### TUNE TO A STATION

**To Auto-tune a station:**

Press the **TUNE-/SKIP-** or **TUNE+/SKIP+** button (or  /  button on remote control) for more than 2 seconds, the unit will search for an available station and then start to broadcast it.

### Auto Memory Storing:

Press the **SCAN** button on the remote control to search and save usable stations.


**NOTE:** The unit can only store 20 FM stations and 10 AM stations at most. If your favorite station has not been stored you need to save it manually. (Refer to “TO STORE A STATION MANUALLY”.)

### To tune a station manually:

Press the **TUNE-/SKIP-** or **TUNE+/SKIP+** button (or  /  button on remote control) briefly to find a station manually.



## TO IMPROVE THE RECEPTION

If you find the AM station is not clearly enough, turn the unit to another direction until you find the station is very clear in a particular direction, since the AM band antenna is internal and directional.



If you find the FM station is not clearly enough, extend the power cable as it acts an FM antenna. When the FM reception is strong, the unit will turn to stereo broadcast and the stereo icon () will show on the display.

## TO STORE A STATION MANUALLY

You can store 20 FM stations and 10 AM stations at most.

1. Press the **MEMORY** button and the “P” appears and digits “01” start to blink on the display.
2. Press the **M-/MENU** or **M+/SELECT** button (or  /  button on remote control) to select a memory address.
3. Press the **MEMORY** button again and the station has been saved.

## TO LISTEN TO A STORED STATION

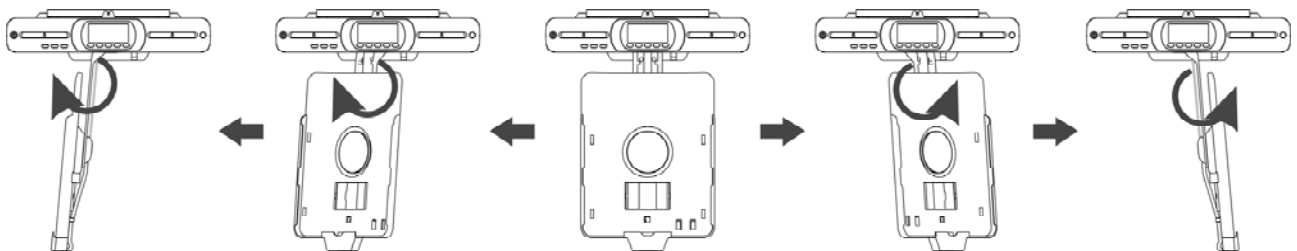
In radio mode, press the **M-/MENU** or **M+/SELECT** button (or  /  button on remote control) to select a station you have stored.

## PLAY A DOCKED DEVICE

### ROTATE THE DOCK AT VALID ANGLES

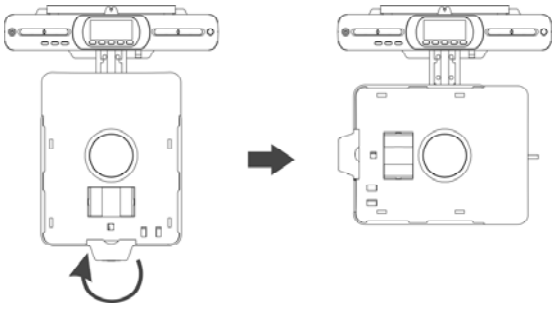
The dock can swivel 45 or 90 degree radius. Hold the dock neck and swivel it.

**IMPORTANT:** The dock can only swivel as shown below. Do not force it to turn in other angles as it could damage the unit.



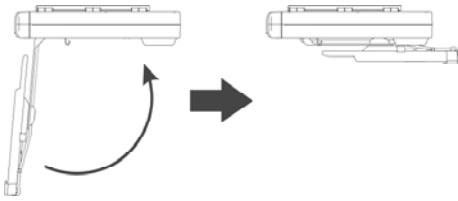
You can also dock the iPad on either portrait mode or landscape mode.

**IMPORTANT:** The dock can only swivel in single direction as shown below. Do not force it to turn in other direction as it could damage the unit.



## RESTRACT THE DOCK

If you do not dock any device, retract the dock.



## TO DOCK THE IPAD/IPHONE

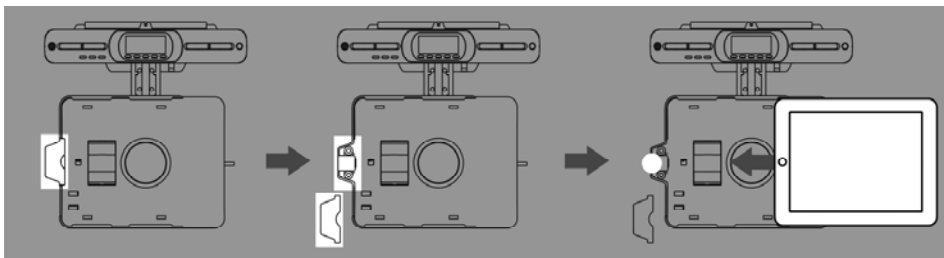
The 30-pin connector is located at the bottom of the dock and is designated to be floating on purpose so as to accommodate all devices of iPad and iPhone.

When your device is docked and connected to the 30-pin connector, sounds will only come out from the built-in stereo speakers on this unit and your device will be muted.

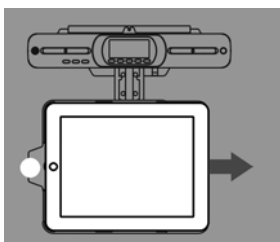
**TIPS:** Remove the dock cover before you dock your device.

### iPad:

- Turn the dock in the direction shown as below. Remove the dock cover. Slide your iPad from right to left to the 30-pin connector. Press and fix the connector then connect the iPad to the connector. Refit the dock cover.

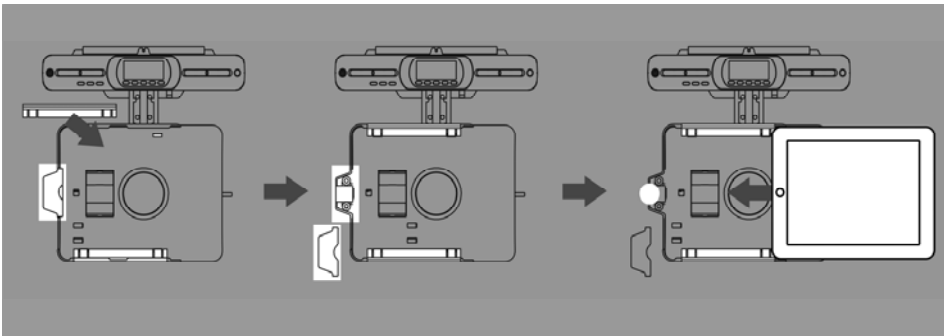


- To remove the iPad, press on the dock cover then slide out your iPad.

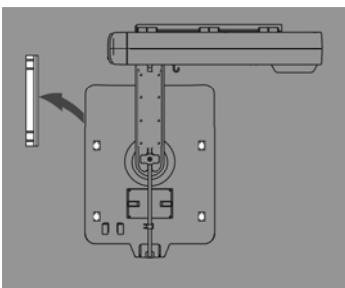


**NOTE:** To fully hold the iPad 2 insert the iPad 2 brackets before you dock the device.

- Obvious the install grooves on both sides of the dock. Match the pins on iPad 2 bracket with the grooves and press the pins into the grooves. Then slide your iPad 2 into the dock.

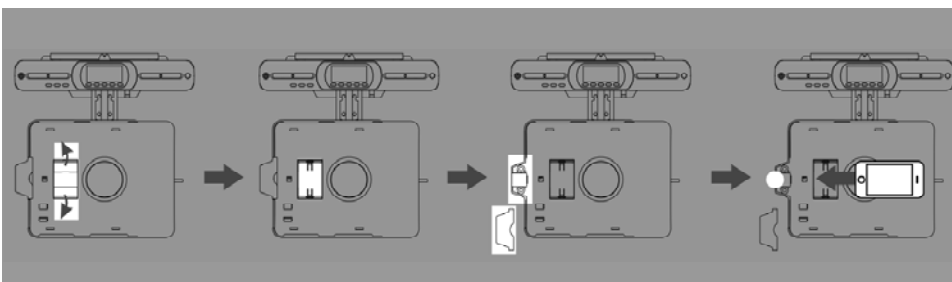


- To remove the iPad 2 bracket, press down the pins with your fingers.

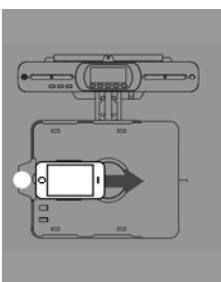


#### iPhone:

- Turn the dock in the direction shown as below. Make the dock bracket “stand-up”. Remove the dock cover then slide your iPhone from left to right to the 30-pin connector. Press and fix the connector and connect your iPhone to the connector. Refit the dock cover.



- To remove the iPhone, press on the dock cover then slide out your iPhone.




## PLAY THE iPad/iPHONE

When the device is docked onto the unit, press the **FUNCTION** button repeatedly to select radio mode.

### 1. General Control Buttons


**PLAY/PAUSE** button (▶||): It works as the “PLAY/PAUSE” button in the iPod.

**STOP** button (■): It works as the “STOP” button in the iPod.

**M-/MENU** button (or  button on remote control): It works as the “MENU” button in the iPod.

**M+/SELECT** button (or **SELECT** button on remote control): It works as the “SELECT” button in the iPod.


**TUNE-/SKIP-** button (or  button on remote control): It works as the “PREVIOUS” button in the iPod.

**TUNE+/SKIP+** button (or  button on remote control): It works as the “NEXT” button in the iPod.

**UP** button (or ▲ button on remote control): It works as the “▲” button in the iPod.

**DOWN** button (or ▼ button on remote control): It works as the “▼” button in the iPod.





### 2. Charging The Device

The unit will charge the device during docking via the 30-pin connector, the charging voltage is 5V  2.1A.

**NOTE: The 30-pin connector does not charge your device in radio mode.**

## USE THE ALARM

**Prerequisite:** The unit MUST be set to STANDBY mode.

1. Press and hold the **ALARM** button (or  button on the remote control) the hour digits start to flash.
2. Press the **UP / DOWN** button (or ▲ / ▼ button on remote control) to set the hours.
3. Then press the **ALARM** button (or  button on the remote control) again the minute digits start to flash.
4. Press the **UP / DOWN** button (or ▲ / ▼ button on remote control) to set the minutes.
5. During the minute digits are still blinking press the **FUNCTION** button repeatedly to select the alarm source: radio () , iPod () or buzzer (default setting, no icon for buzzer). Then wait for approximately 5 seconds and the setting will be saved automatically.

**NOTE:** The setting of the alarm time and source must be set without any interruption.

6. When the time goes off, press the **ALARM** or **STANDBY/ON** button to stop it sounding.


### Fast Switch On / Off The Alarm


Briefly press the **ALARM** button (or  button on remote control) to activate or deactivate the alarm function.

## SET THE SLEEP TIMER (TIME OFF)

You can set the SLEEP TIMER (TIME OFF) so the unit turns itself off after a specified time.


**Prerequisite:** The unit MUST be set ON.

1. Press the **TIME OFF** button (or  button on remote control), "90" flashes on the display.

Continue to press the **TIME OFF** button (or  button on remote control) until the desired time appears on the display.

2. Do not touch any button and wait for approximately 4 seconds, the display reverse the previous working interface and the timer starts to work.

### TIPS:

If you want to terminate the TIME OFF function, press the **STANDBY/ON** button *or* keep pressing the **TIME OFF** button until "00" appears on the display then wait for approximately 4 seconds. The TIME OFF function will be canceled and the icon () will disappear.

If you want to check the remaining time, press the TIME OFF button once, the remaining time will be displayed for a few seconds.
